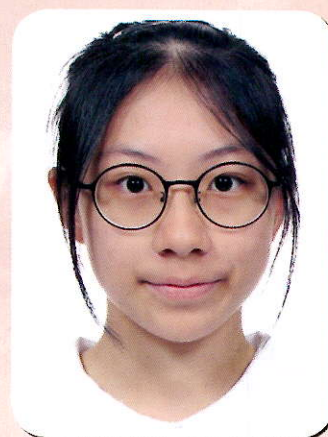

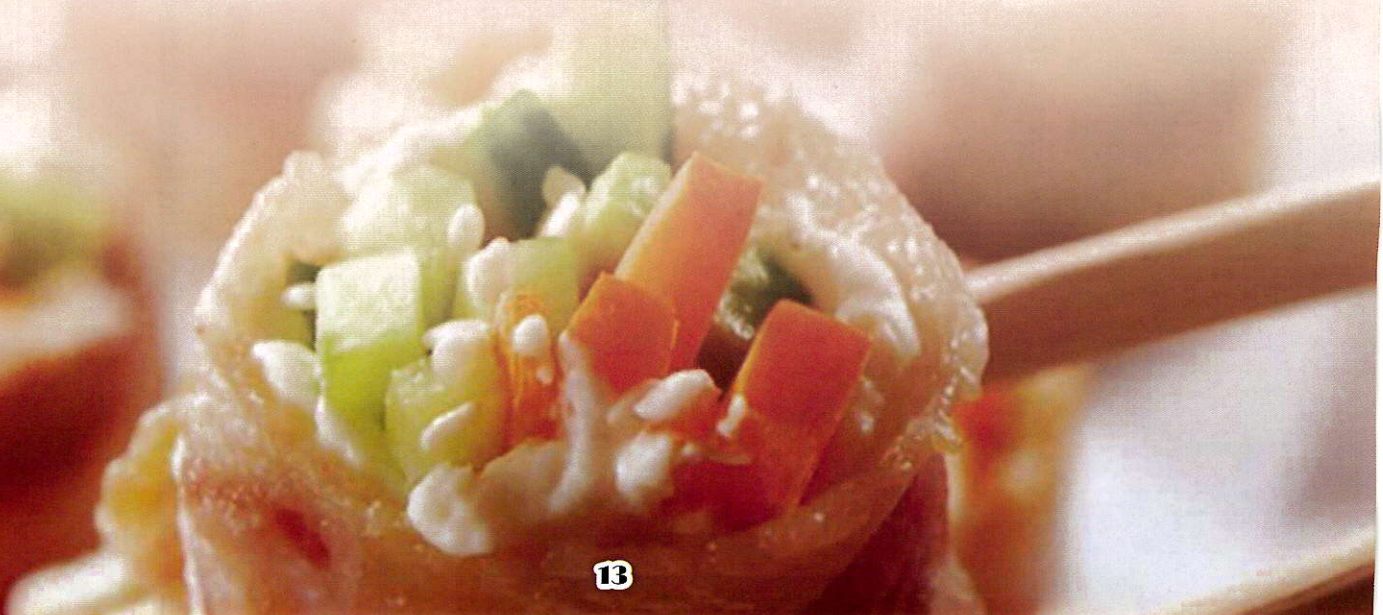
Now, let me tell you more about sushi roll with bacon. That is very easy to make. You can find the recipe of sushi roll with bacon below.

Our club aims to foster, enrich, strengthen, and promote our activities.

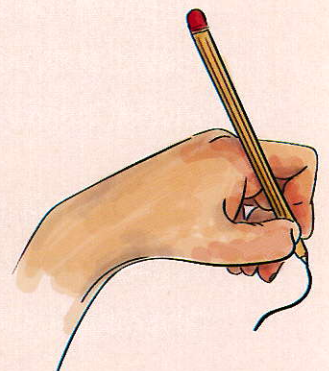

Realizing how dire the situation was, Mary's parents were determined to help her. For the following three weeks, her family encouraged her to undergo medical treatment and seek professional counselling. At first, Mary was uncooperative. However, with the non-imposing attitude of her family, she decided to take the first step. Day by day, her parents' patience and perseverance paid off. Mary was willing to carry out anti-drug campaigns with her family, understanding the harm caused by drug abuse. She regretted taking drugs, and confessed to her parents why she made the wrong decision.

Eventually, she beat the temptation and successfully stayed free from drugs. Mary's story makes me realize it is vital to care for our friends. Back then, I was disappointed by her behaviour. Curry Beef Brisket

Hello guys! Do you like cooking at home? During Covid-19, I've learnt to make different dishes from my mum at home. Today I will teach you how to cook curry beef brisket.

First, bring a large pot of water to boil and add in spring onions and ginger. Then blanch the beef for 5-7 minutes to remove scum. After that drain beef and set aside. Next, in a pot, add 2 teaspoons of cooking oil over medium high heat. Then add onion, garlic, and chili. Cook until onion starts to soften. After that, add beef, bay leaves, Chu Hou paste, and curry paste. Then stir-fry until combined and fragrant. Next, add enough water to cover beef, add beef cube, sugar, and bring it up to a boil. After that, lower heat to simmer, cover with a tight-fitting lid and simmer 90 minutes. Then, check every now and then to make sure water has not evaporated too much. Next, add carrot and potatoes to the pot. And then season with salt to taste. Cover to cook for 10 minutes. Then pour in coconut milk, and enough corn starch to thicken the sauce to the desired consistency. Then stir and allow to cook for another 10 minutes. Finally, remove from heat and serve garnished with chopped coriander leaves.

I hope you will enjoy this dish and try to make it at home.

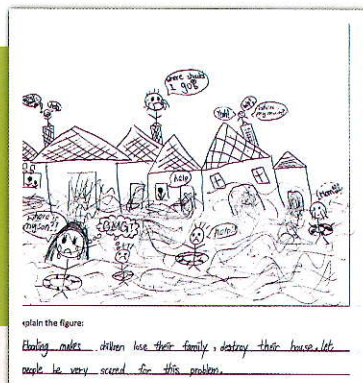
Geography
