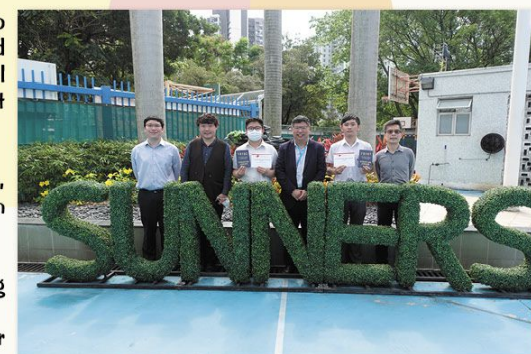


HARVARD BOOK PRIZE

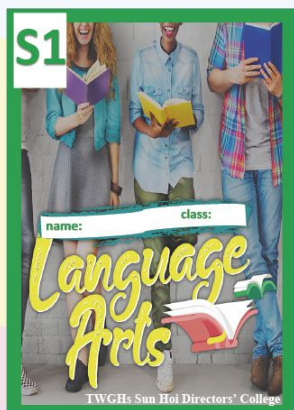
